With this biblical concept being our motivating factor, our church will be hosting, on our front lawn, a panel sharing personal stories of racism in our Valley. We will also be encouraging people to sign up for Dialogues on Racism to help us better understand this problem. Masks will be required and social distancing will be encouraged.

We are hoping that this can be a step forward for all of us to grow in our knowledge and depth of understanding so that the Mahoning Valley can be known for abounding in God's love! Please come Sunday, July 26 at 5:00PM. When the body of Christ is unified, God's abounding love will be present.

### CHURCH CABINET

#### We are excited to receive overwhelming survey response!

As you know, the Church Cabinet requested survey feedback to help guide our prayerful and thoughtful discussion around how to return our congregation to service in our sanctuary in a safe manner while reaching the most people with the love and hope of our Savior Jesus Christ. While we are still collecting and organizing the final results of the survey, we are very excited by the strong response we have received from 76 individuals. The Church Cabinet wanted to provide some of the preliminary results in an effort to maintain full transparency of the results. As the Cabinet has the opportunity to analyze the feedback and make decisions around how we will move forward as one family in Christ, there will be additional communications.

The demographics of the survey results are largely consistent with membership of the church. Very close to 50% of the responses were from members that attend the second traditional service. We are excited to have a small response of about 5% from new Attendees that were attracted to our current "Drive-in" style of service during the pandemic. The remaining responses of near 45% came from first Praise service membership. Similarly, our age demographics align with our current church membership with close to 60% of the responses coming from individuals over 60 years old.

The responses around when everyone would feel comfortable returning to the internal sanctuary started to become a little more mixed. The strongest responses were from those that would be comfortable once the public health mandates are lifted by the State of Ohio (29% of respondents) and those that would be comfortable to start attending in the August-September timeframe (29% of respondents). This should give us some time to continue to use the "Drivein" style of service while we thoughtfully prepare to return to the internal sanctuary. There was much more consistency in the feedback around making sure we follow the public health mandates of social distancing, required face masks, facility sanitizing, hand sanitizer or washing, limiting access to restrooms and elevators and temporarily eliminating gathers for coffee and donuts.


An important question that we received everyone's thoughts on, involved what style of service would best attract and reach the most people to grow our outreach with the love and hope of our Savior Jesus Christ when we returned to the internal sanctuary. In this area, the overwhelming response (75% of respondents) was to return to a single service, with the majority (56% of respondents) recommending a combined Praise and Traditional Service.

We want to thank everyone for taking the time to answer the survey. The results are very informative and the written responses will be very valuable to help make sure we can bring the love and hope of Christ to the most people possible. We received a number of very positive comments recognizing the great work to create the "Drive-in" Service and the ability to provide a "live" service on Facebook to modernize and leverage social media. People appear to be excited about a fresh start that appeals to all generation worship styles and that will unify our church and community. In the end, we pray that the Holy Spirit inspires us to follow Christ's plan for our Church.
